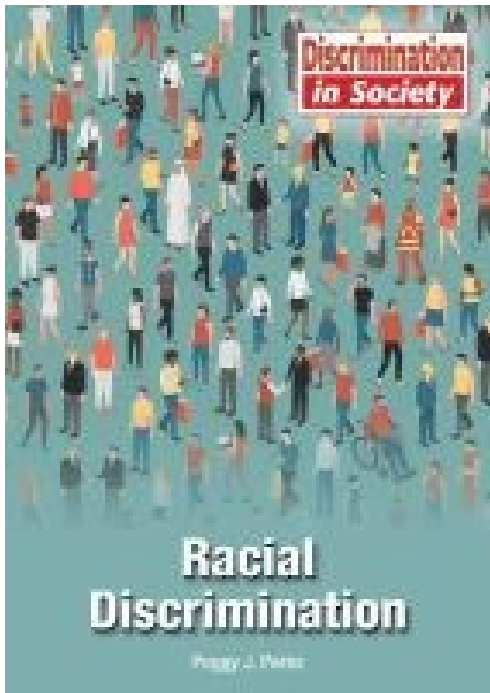

At least, that is the perspective of many African Americans, civil rights groups, and other concerned individuals, who believe that what occurred in Flint was not an isolated incident. Rather, they view the Flint crisis as a microcosm of what is happening throughout the United States.

20	But people of color still face many hurdles and do not always enjoy the same rights and privileges as white people.
21	In recent years a surge of news coverage in the United States has focused on police shootings or unarmed black males. Civil rights advocates and many other members of the general public have grown increasingly alarmed by the number of shootings and the role racial discrimination seems to have played in them.
22	In terms of actual numbers, more whites were killed by police than people of color. But non-Hispanic whites represent 62 percent of the US population, whereas blacks are slightly over 13 percent, and Hispanics 18 percent. When adjusting for these population differences, African Americans and Hispanics were killed by police far more often than whites.
